

The James A. Lindner Prize

The James A. Lindner Prize was awarded jointly by the South East Asia Pacific Audio Visual Archives Association (SEAPAVAA), The Association for Moving Image Archivists (AMIA), and the International Association of Sound and Audiovisual Archives (IASA).

The Prize was awarded to an individual, group of individuals or an organization for research, which by its originality, breadth and scope, is having or may potentially have a major impact on the technology of the preservation of moving images and/or recorded sound.

The Prize recognized and rewarded outstanding contributions to research in the field of the technology of preservation of moving images and recorded sound. The research or achievement for which the award was made included:

- Available for publication or dissemination so that others may benefit from it
- An original contribution to the sum total of professional knowledge in the field
- Technically relevant to the needs of AV archives or other organizations that have custody of the materials
- Technology-based: may belong to any aspect of audiovisual technology in its broadest sense
