Special Projects with Students and Chapters

Student-L Listserv

The student listserv was approved for one year by the board in the summer of 2015 and was reviewed with a survey in September 2016, sent to both the student list-serv and student chapters. Feedback on the usefulness of the list-serv was mixed. The committee co-chairs will submit a report to the AMIA Board following the AMIA conference with suggestions for moving forward.

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Student Chapter Handbook

Jen O'Leary volunteered to work with existing student chapters to identify valuable information and resources needed for student chapters when establishing and maintaining their chapters. The guide is currently in draft form and will be reviewed and launched on the Education Committee site sometime in 2017.

Education Committee Site

Our website has been maintained by both co-chairs and Kathy Short, who contributed to the resources pages and AV Archiving Events Calendar.

The committee continued the Getting to Know You blog series from 2015, adding the Creative Skillset traineeship to the series. It also launched a Student Spotlight series over the summer of 2016.

Between October 2015 and 2016:

- Over 6,600 unique visitors and 13,700 views
- 178 followers, up 105 from 2015

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The top resources accessed on the site continue to be the So You want to be an Audiovisual Archivist article, the Jobs page, the Getting to Know You and Student Spotlight blog series, and the Graduate and Undergraduate Programs page.

AV Archiving Jobs Site (306 followers, up 217 from 2015)

Michelle Roell volunteered to post all positions emailed to the site, forwarded from AMIA listservs or found by the co-chairs.

Between October 2015 and 2016:

- Over 12,000 unique visitors and 39,000 views
- Posted 332 positions in 2016 (internships, fellowships, full-time, part-time and term) compared to 213 positions in 2015.

AMIA Calendar

The committee collaborated with the AMIA Office to create a shared calendar of audiovisual archiving events that would be hosted on the main AMIA site and maintained by a team of volunteers.
